Dear Men of the Master,

If I could be one of Jesus' twelve disciples, I would want to be Peter. Like Peter, I have my 'masters' in putting my foot in my mouth, missing the point, and even betrayal. Yet for all of Peter's missteps, he still serves as a role model for me. He was the one who preached the Pentecost sermon that led 3000 to follow Jesus (Acts 2), he was the one who broke down the barrier between Jewish and Gentile believers (Acts 11), and he was the one who got out of the boat to walk on water (Matt. 14).

'Walking on water' describes how I feel now. Deerfoot is in a place we've never been before and it is a long way from the safety of the boat. We're out in the churning sea. Our wind and waves are the massive challenge of getting DL Blue Ridge built in time, and paying for it. Sometimes, I long for the boat where things were far more manageable and secure because out here at sea...I feel vulnerable.

Then I remember Peter, who quickly sank when he took his eyes off Jesus and focussed on the threatening conditions.

Suddenly, walking on water seemed like a bad idea. It's not safe and it doesn't make sense, until Jesus intervenes. It's a simple lesson: there is no water-walking without Jesus' power. I'm not sure my faith has ever been tested as it is these days. Keeping my eyes on Jesus is a full time job.

How about you? Do you have courage enough to get out of the boat and follow Him? Are you already out there, but sinking under the threats? Join me in trusting and following Him courageously. Let's fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our Faith (Hebrews 12:2).

This issue of the DL Tracks provides the 'low-down' on what it will take to launch Deerfoot Blue Ridge in 2019. We're moving full steam ahead, but we face challenges.

A couple of quick snapshots from this summer at Deerfoot Adirondack:

- An Indian camper confided in his teepee mates that he was ready to give up on the Church and Christian community altogether. Not only were his friends quick to go to prayer with him (at their own suggestion), but they were the literal embodiment of the Church in that moment, demonstrating how important Christian community is. They didn't know how to answer, and yet they, themselves were God's answer to that young man's need.

- A Woodsman camper was an expert in all things internet and television. He had memorized the theme-song to every streaming television show, and showed all the signs of having been glued to a screen for most of the year before arriving at Deerfoot for the first time. Upon arrival he seemed overwhelmed by all the relationships he was confronted with – real people with whom he had to interact and work as a team. His counselor, however, applied one simple tool to the problem: focused attention. By the end of the first week, the two were inseparable. By the end of the second, the two were talking about what it means to follow Jesus.

So what's the report from DL ADK? The mission is happening. In other words, God is changing the world, one life at a time, and we're witnesses to his grace.



DL ADK Work Weekend

What a blessing it is to walk through camp after a work weekend. Of course the foliage on the Dugs and the crunch of fallen leaves beneath my feet is satisfying, but it is the finished projects, the evidence of hard work from volunteers around every corner that remind me most of God's provision for Deerfoot. Our faithful team of volunteers worked together this fall continuing the construction of a new Beaver Cabin, building a timber stairway near Founder's Lodge, opening up the driveway and building a safe walkway at Loon Cabin, rebuilding a crumbling access ramp to the flushing tree, putting some solar lighting into the Owl cabin, and even jacking up a cabin to replace a faulty footing. All this, while another team of volunteers cooked 9 delicious and filling meals for the group. It never ceases to amaze me what work weekenders can accomplish. As is so often the case in Deerfoot's history, our volunteers are not intimidated by the size of the task. They simply pull on some gloves and get to work.



2018 ADK Operations Report

Praise the Lord for another great season of building godly men in a Christ-centered community through wilderness camping. Here are some of the operational highlights from the 2018 season:

- 627 campers (96% capacity)
- Over 160 volunteers served at Work Weekends and during the summer season.
- 65 campers received scholarship help. These were made possible through contributions to the camper scholarship fund.
- CampMinder, our new registration and forms management software was launched successfully.
- Major Capital Improvements: Purchase of two new 15 passenger vans, one new generator, new Mink cabin, and more!
- Over 180 written evaluations received from campers and parents—helpful feedback!
- 23 participated at Winter Trek in the High Peaks

2019 Camper Registration

The leaves have turned and the morning frost is beginning to show up, which means registration season is nearly upon us at Deerfoot. This is a monumental year for camp, with sessions at Deerfoot Blue Ridge appearing as options for the first time! As you register, you can expect the process to work virtually the same as it did last year. You will be able to register for either Deerfoot Adirondack or Blue Ridge using the same CampMinder account. We are continuing with the CampMinder platform, and if you have not logged into your CampInTouch account ("CampInTouch" is the name of your personal account within the CampMinder system), we recommend that you do so before registration to make sure all your personal contact info is up to date. Check your email and Deerfoot.org/registration for more information as the dates draw closer.

As in the past, registration will proceed in phases:
PHASE 1: December 1 – Returning campers, siblings of returning campers, and those who have been on the waitlist for 2 years or more may register at this time.
PHASE 2: December 15 – Campers who were on the waitlist in 2018 may register.

PHASE 3: January 2 – Open registration begins!

Note: Each camper may register for one session at one camp. Registration for additional sessions will begin on February 1.
